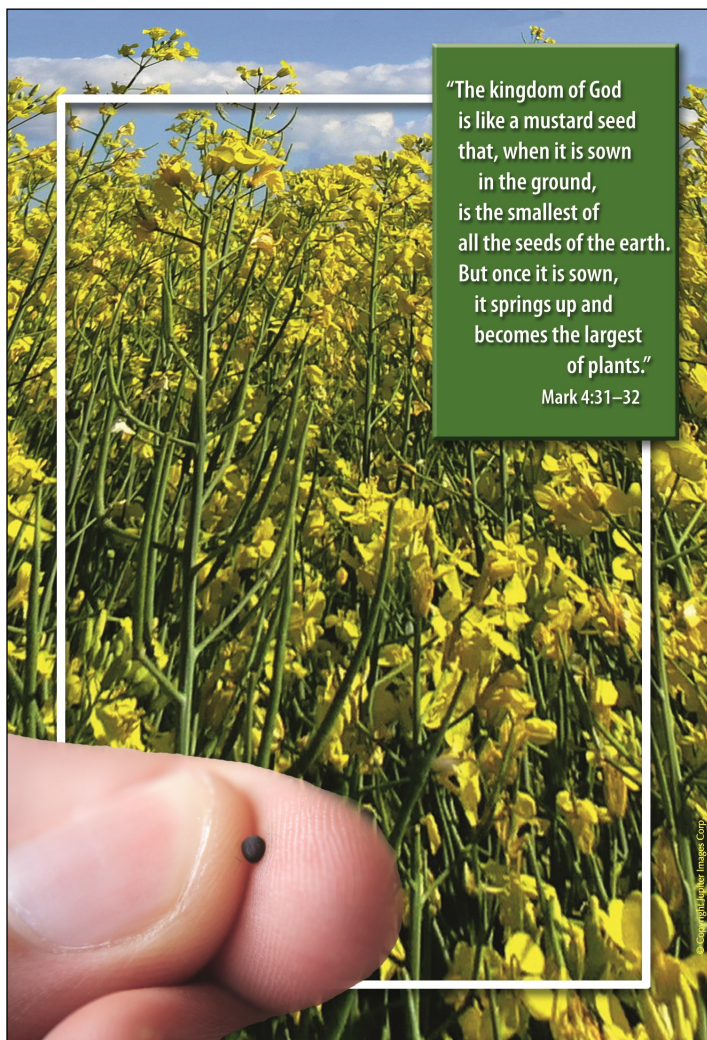

The Church and God's Kingdom

Today's scriptures connect the towering cedars of Lebanon from the prophet Ezekiel to the mustard plant of the famous parable of Jesus. Both plants represent the Kingdom of God. Both are also to be understood as symbols of the Church, where "birds of every kind shall dwell" (Ezekiel 17:23) and shelter in the cedar's branches, and the shade of the mustard plant's large branches provide dwelling for the "birds of the sky." Even today's psalm tells of the just one who is like a cedar flourishing in the house of the Lord.

Now, the Church is not the Kingdom, but rather a sacrament, a visible sign of it. They co-exist in the here-and-now but also in the "not yet." As Paul reminds us, we must constantly work to continue building and growing the Kingdom by everyday good works of "the just one." So we are all just ones.

Scroll Design Chosen

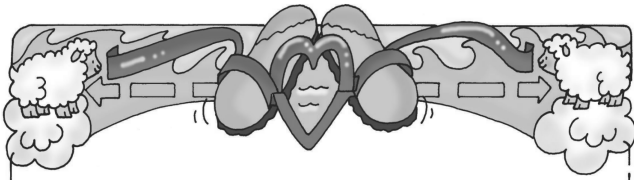
This is to inform about the design process and references for the Our Lady of Prompt Succor background around the main painting of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The design uses several elements pulled from art history in the time period of the event of the Battle of New Orleans and the figures and accents within the church itself.

The acanthus leaf design used to transition from the prayer to the figures' medallion is a traditional French design and decor element. It can be found in many churches, sculptures, fabrics and woodwork or plasterwork. It is meant to guide the eye of the viewer to the figure in an uplifting and seamless way.

Also, it is a design element that was prominently featured in designs of the era of the Battle of New Orleans. It would have been a common motif seen by those involved in praying for the safety of New Orleans and the area. Note also the *fleur de lis* incorporated as a nod to our common heritage.

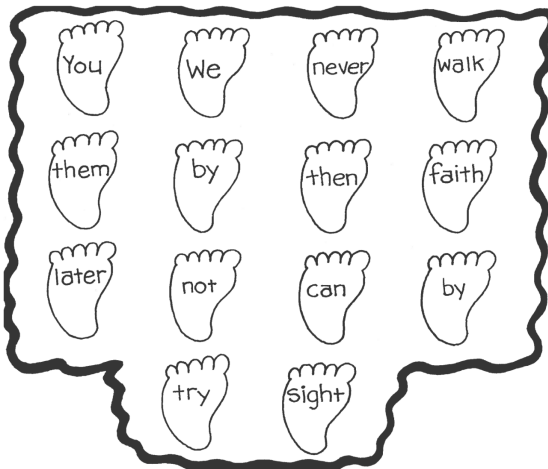
The fluid movements of the design relate as well, to the details found in pedestals at the front of the church and the figure of the Christ child featured at the rear of the church. This design was reached after a few extensive meetings with both Fr. Benie and Mrs. Marie Falgoust. The mural painting will take approximately four weeks to complete. During this time, the tabernacle will **temporarily** be located to the right of the altar near the statue of Saint Joseph.
